Heartland Habitat Partners with Roeland Park, Kansas to Help Local Residents Meet Code

Roeland Park, Kansas, in partnership with Heartland Habitat for Humanity, recently launched its new Community Beautification Initiative. This program helps local homeowners maintain their properties and meet city codes for upkeep. Roeland Park government, civic leaders and employees from Seaboard Corporation are pitching in all summer, assisting with the clean-up efforts by trimming trees, gardening, removing brush and more.

"We have a lot of people in our city who have not been working and just want to give them a helping hand," said Roeland Park Mayor Adrienne Foster.

Many of the residents receiving assistance are either physically unable to do the chores, or may be out of work and unable to afford the tools or landscaping materials needed for maintaining their property.



"This is what we like to call, A Brush with Kindness," said Tom Lally, Executive Director of Heartland Habitat. "Roeland Park's care for its citizens is a wonderful example, and we are so pleased to be partnering with them on our neighborhood revitalization efforts."

Ripple Glass Donates 66,000 Pounds of Insulation to Local Habitat Affiliates

Ripple Glass, Kansas City's local glass recycling processor, has donated 66,000 pounds of Owens Corning's PINK fiberglass insulation to three area Habitat for Humanity organizations, including Heartland Habitat for Humanity. Owens Corning is a local Ripple Glass customer that converts Ripple's processed recycled glass into fiberglass insulation, saving substantial amounts of energy while dramatically lowering air and water emissions.

The three local Habitat affiliates will use the material in exterior walls and attics of approximately 36 homes to be built across the Kansas City metropolitan area this year.
